#### Lorida Meeting - May 21

Approximately 50 people gathered at the Lorida Community center to organize our new lake

association. Special guests included J.D. Barrett, Highlands County Commissioner, Bob Bullard and Edwin Stokes, candidates for Highlands County Commissioners, Mary Carter and Barbara Bazley, Highlands County Lakes Association (HCLA) Sandy Dwinell opened the meeting with a brief history of how Friends Of Istokpoga was formed and the events that lead up to the meeting. She then introduced Mary Carter from HCLA.

Mary explained that with more than eighty lakes in the county that the HCLA needed help, and that each lake was being asked to form its own lake association to focus on their lake. The HCLA would act as an umbrella organization and would provide information and assistance to the individual lake associations

Bill Dwinell then talked about the Lake Istokpoga Management Committee, managed by the Highlands County Commissioners.. He has requested a seat on this

committee for Friends Of Istokpoga.

Bill also talked about a recent air boat trip around the lake with Ken Denson, Florida Game and Freshwater Fish Commission Biologist, in which the need for tussock removal was explained.

Sandy Dwinell next introduced the volunteers for director of Friends Of Istokpoga. They were Jim Berry, George Cook, Bill Dwinell, Debbie Galloway, Walter Monroe (not present due to illness) , Jack Newkirk, and Jim Wilkins. It was moved and seconded that the nominations be accepted. It was unanimously accepted by those present by a show of hands.

The meeting was then adjourned.

### Istokpoga Wildlife

Wild birds and animals may not be kept as pets, according to Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission regulations. You must have special permits and licenses to keep wildlife. If wildlife is discovered in your possession without the proper permits, you will be subject to heavy fines.

If you discover abandoned, injured or orphaned wildlife you should report it:

- Wrede's Wildlife Rehabilitation Center -(941)385-2770
- Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission (800)282-8002
- Bring the animal to the center at 4900 Wilderness Trail in Sebring.

### Tussock Removal from Lake

Tussock? Do you know what tussock is? Well, Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission (FG&F) does and they are working to remove some of it from the lake. Tussock are the floating plant masses that surround Big Island and Bumblebee Island and line much of the shores of our lake. Estimates range from 1900 to 2500 acres of the lake are covered by tussock.

You may have seen the tussock harvester at work on Big Island the past few months. It has been slowly eating up tussock and depositing into what FG&F calls "Wildlife Islands". The harvester has completed work for the summer, but will return in September. So far it has opened up about

25 acres of prime fish and wildlife habitat per FG&F.

The harvester will be working inside the cattail wall at the north end of Big Island when it returns.

The wildlife islands will be posted with reflective signs.

# Lake Istokpoga Becomes Fish Management Area

Don't forget, as of July 1, 1998, Lake Istokpoga became a designated fish management area. This means the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission will take over management of the lake. It also means that you can no longer fish with cane poles without a fishing license. For more information call Beacham Furse (941-462-5190)
